The contractor carries out the testing as an operator under medical product law in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions with qualified health personnel who have the necessary training or knowledge and experience. There is no medical treatment. According to § 24 sentence 2 of the Infection Protection Act, a doctor's reservation no longer applies to near-patient rapid tests when testing for SARS-CoV-2 since the legal change of November 18, 2020, so that in the contractual relationship, the provisions of §§ 630a et seq. BGB (German Civil Code) do not apply directly or accordingly on patient law; and the contractor is solely subject to the operator obligations of § 3 MPBetreibV (Medical Product Operator Regulations). The client is informed that a negative test result does not release him from complying with the hygiene rules (AHA+L (Distance, hygiene, everyday mask + airing)) and that a positive test result, due to its lower sensitivity and specificity, must be generally confirmed by means of a PCR test according to the requirements of the Robert Koch Institute 1).

1) Any necessary PCR tests are carried out by the health department of the district of North Saxony. Those tested with a positive rapid test result should immediately contact the health department at 03421 758-5555 or your family doctor.

The contractor is only obliged to report the client by name to the responsible health authority in accordance with §§ 6 to 9 IfSG if there is justified suspicion of an acute infection. Whether an acute infection is present must take into account the properties of the test used, the preliminary examinations carried out and the anamnestic information as part of a medical laboratory

report. In the event of a positive result of the rapid antigen test, the client is responsible for further clarification by means of a PCR test, which may lead to a report according to §§ 6 to 9 IfSG. Post-testing by means of a PCR test is a service provided by the GKV/PKV (health insurance) as a health treatment or can be carried out free of charge according to the TestV (test regulation).

As part of the quick test, the client's personal data is processed. For the purpose of diagnostics, the contractor will keep an electronic or written list in which he will include the testings he has carried out per day with these data and the test results. The data is electronically forwarded to the rapid test portal. It can be viewed at: <https://www.telekom.de/datenschutzhinweise> The data processing corresponds to Art. 6 Para. 1 in conjunction with Art. 9 Para. 2 lit. a GDPR. The stored data will be deleted as soon as they have fulfilled the intended purpose and there are no longer any statutory retention periods or if the client revokes his consent to data processing. The client has understood the above information and agrees to it.

I was informed about the implementation, the risks and the storage of personal data in connection with the test.

I was informed about the obligation to notify the health department and the necessary follow-up testing by means of a PCR test in the event of a positive result. Furthermore, I was informed about the obligation to isolate myself at home immediately or to isolate myself within the facility in the event of a positive test result.

## Info sheet on isolation in Saxony

Valid from 25 April 2022

### What to do if you suspect SARS-CoV-2 infection, receive a positive test result or are a close contact?

#### 1. IF AN INFECTION IS SUSPECTED

Your self-test (without supervision) was positive or you have COVID symptoms and have made a PCR test?

- You must remain at home (i.e., isolate yourself). You may only leave your home or accommodation to go to the doctor or to take a PCR test.
- In the event of a positive self-test, you need to get tested - by a doctor if you have symptoms, otherwise at a testing centre.
- If you live together with other people, avoid them as far as possible.
- Please advise your employer if you suspect you may be infected.

If the PCR test is negative, the isolation ceases immediately. Save the negative test result. If the PCR test is positive, you must remain in isolation (see: 2. *positive test result*).

#### 2. IN THE EVENT OF A POSITIVE TEST RESULT:

Have you received a positive result from a rapid antigen test or PCR test?

- If you have received a positive result from a rapid antigen test, you need to take a PCR test.
- You must stay at home (i.e. isolate) for at least five days. Use the quarantine calculator (see the website of your local district or independent municipality) to calculate when your isolation period will end.
- You are only allowed out to go to the doctor or take a test.
- If you live with other people and have had close contact with them in the last two days, you must immediately inform them that you are positive and that they must also stay home (see: 3. *Close contact*).
- Also inform anyone else you had contact with two days before the test or your symptoms (see: 3. *Close contact*).
- Avoid being close to people in your home so that you do not infect them.
- Advise your employer or, if applicable, any relevant school/child day-care facility.
- Your PCR test result will serve as proof of your infection and isolation. Please keep the test result. You will need it for your certificate of recovery.
- If you have not had any symptoms for 48 hours, you can end your isolation from day 5 onwards. You don't need to take a test at the end.
- Please be particularly careful until day 10: wear a mask if you are near others, reduce your contact and do not meet with sick or elderly people.
- If you still feel ill or have symptoms, you will need to keep isolating (until max. day 10). If you have not had any symptoms for 48 hours, your isolation can end. Loss of taste or smell often lasts longer and does not count here.
- Anyone working in nursing, medical care or integration support will need to provide a negative test in order to resume work. This does not apply if they have been in isolation for at least 10 days.

#### 3. IN THE EVENT OF CLOSE CONTACT WITH A PERSON WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE (close contact):

Do you live with someone, or have you had close contact with someone, who has tested positive?

- Then you do **not** have to stay home (isolate).
- All contacts must be particularly careful for 10 days after the last contact or the household member's positive result. Look out for typical symptoms, get tested on day 3 or 4 after contact, interact with as few people as possible, and wear a mask when doing so. Please do not meet with sick or elderly people.
- Anyone who has symptoms should get tested immediately and is then considered a suspected case (see: 1. *Suspected case*).
